- A mí, me gusta montar en Bicicleta
- También me gusta jugar en baloncesto

(I also like playing basketball)



Using  
**GUSTAR**  
followed by  
actions

For verbs, we ALWAYS use the  
\_\_\_\_singular\_\_\_\_form: “**gusta**” even when  
we are talking about multiple activities.

Ex) I like to sing, dance, and act.

Me **gusta** cantar, bailar, y actuar.

Ex) She likes to play soccer, ride bikes, and  
ski.

A ella, le **gusta** jugar al fútbol, montar en  
bicicleta, y esquiar.

**Using  
GUSTAR  
followed  
by single  
nouns**

We ALWAYS use the  
\_\_\_\_singular\_\_\_\_ form:  
“gusta” when it is followed by  
a singular noun


Me gusta el fútbol

Me gusta la pizza

A él, le gusta el rock

Using  
**GUSTAR**  
followed by  
**PLURAL**  
nouns

When GUSTAR is followed by a **plural** noun, you need to use the plural form of the verb “gustan”

- Me **gustan** los videojuegos
  - A ella, le **gustan** las galletas (cookies)
  - Me **gustan** los deportes
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## Now, you try

- I like to spend time with friends
- He likes to play videogames
- I like to swim and play baseball. (béisbol)
- She likes to draw and write stories.
- I like to practice sports and walk. (caminar)

# Agreeing

Alicia: - A mí, me gusta bailar ( I like to dance)

Miguel: - A mi, **también** (me too)

Carlos: - A mí, me gustan los videojuegos

Rodrigo: A mí, **también**





If you like something A  
LOT

**¡Me gusta mucho  
bailar!**

# Disagreeing

Alicia: - A mí, **no** me gusta bailar  
( I don't like to dance)

Miguel: - A mí, **tampoco**  
(me neither)

Carlos: - A mí, **no** me gustan los  
videojuegos

Rodrigo: A mí, **tampoco**



To not like  
something at  
all...

- To make your negative statements even stronger, you can use the word “nada” after the form of “gustar” to say you don’t like it at all.
  - No me gusta nada correr.  
(I don’t like running at all)
  - A Alissa, no le gusta nada leer libros.  
(Alissa doesn’t like to read at all)
  - A mí, no me gusta nada ir a la escuela.  
(I don’t like going to school at all.)

# What if there are multiple things I don't like doing?

Use “ni” before each activity or thing you don't like. Ni...ni = neither nor

- No me gusta **ni** estudiar **ni** montar en bicicleta.
  - I don't like neither studying nor riding bikes.
- No me gustan **ni** los perros **ni** los gatos
  - I don't like neither dogs nor cats.
- A Fernando, no le gusta **ni** dibujar **ni** pintar.
  - Fernando doesn't like neither drawing nor painting
